The second half of the Summer Term has been very busy at Pendarren! After a quick count, we were amazed to find that from May half term onwards we'd had 378 pupils from 21 of Haringey's schools visit the Centre. This year everybody could appreciate the area fully as the fantastic weather finally reached South Wales and Pendarren basked in sunshine for almost all of July. Waterproofs and wellingtons were only brought out for wet adventurous activities as everybody turned instead to sunhats and sun cream. Visiting groups were eager to fall in the river during canoe sessions and the swimming pool reached an all time high – both in popularity and temperature!

The warm weather has encouraged the wildlife at Pendarren and, as well as a multitude of flowers, birds, rabbits and squirrels, there has been an unusual type of visitor to our bird table. Whilst gardening, Dave, our maintenance officer, found a swarm of bumble bees! As the bird table is close to the seating area where everyone eats lunch, we had to ask an apiarist (a bee specialist) to come and remove the swarm. He removed the whole bird table and took it down the drive where he released the bumble bees. They flew off in to the trees and were left to search for a more suitable place for their hive.





Trees

The Friends have purchased some tree labels so that we can label our trees to help teach the students about the variety of life. The marked trees will be used as part of a new orienteering session. The labels will also be used to mark the school plots in the Nicky Harrison Sensory Garden.

Scavenger hunt

As part of our development of the evening activities we have created a Scavenger Hunt. Students will work in teams to search the grounds to see who can find the most items that fit the criteria, which, for example, could be things that fit in a matchbox, different colours, textures, shapes or smells. The aim is to get the students looking more closely at their natural environment.



Art

Also new for the Autumn Term, Pendarren will be offering art as an evening activity. Occasionally visiting school groups bring their own resources and run art sessions in the evening, which have proved very successful. We would like to offer it as one of our standard evening activities. There will be a teacher's resource pack with suggestions and ideas plus boxes of materials. Various art/craft resources will be available together with natural and recyclable materials. If you or your students would like to do some artwork in the evening, see you in the new term!

Refurbishment of heating / plumbing systems

This autumn work is expected to begin to refurbish the heating and plumbing systems in the House and Annexe. As well as making the Annexe warmer this will reduce our fuel bill, allowing more money to be spent on resources for students.

Campsbourne School 3-7 June 2013

Campsbourne pupils were a pleasure to host this week as they undertook an adventurous week at Pendarren House. They hiked up mountains, explored caves, searched out the creatures of the sea and canoed on the Brecon and Monmouthshire canal. They also requested a falconry display and the falconer and his birds came to Pendarren. Some pupils had the opportunity to wear big thick gauntlets to hold the birds whilst they waited for the bird to set off on the next display. They saw a barn owl, peregrine falcon and Harris hawk.

Very well done for the great enthusiasm shown by the pupils and staff alike, we hope to see you again soon.



West Green Primary School 3-7 June 2013

On the day they arrived, West Green Primary pupils visited Abergavenny, the nearest town to Pendarren House, which was built up around the animal market. Students were interested in exploring the castle ruins and were intrigued by the animal pens in the animal market. During Wednesday lunch time, between mountain walk and house riding, the pupils spent some time with the Parachute Challenge; they really enjoyed it -especially the cat and mouse game. The last full day was spent at the coast, the students enjoying being in the sea so much it was hard work to get them out. That night, just before the evening meal, there was a falconry display in the back garden with the Campsbourne pupils. The group were surprised how big the birds were.



Haringey Sixth Form Education 3 – 7 June 2013


I would like to thank you for the memorable week at Pendarren. I've leant that I don't want to work with primary kids as they drive you crazy all the time! Farhiya




Limestone passageways were investigated, and many challenges tackled.

Park View and John Loughborough Team Bonding Course 3 – 7 August 2013


Pendarren was approached at the last minute about the possibility of a residential adventurous activity course for students of Park View and John Loughborough schools to build on new and existing relationships. The aim, as well as developing these relationships, was to challenge the group both individually and as a team in unfamiliar circumstances. The expertise of the Pendarren staff was called on to provide activities which were both stimulating and challenging but which were highly supported. As one student explained:
